Re: Final approval for expenditure of ARPA funds

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds must be obligated through contracts by December 31, 2024. To confirm that we have effectively committed or spent these funds, we reviewed previously approved projects. We determined that several projects could not meet the deadline for full obligation due to timing constraints and legal procurement processes.

Projects with reduced funding:

- Equipment for meeting spaces with hybrid technology was less than requested as other state grants were available for education.
- Rail Trail construction management was less than anticipated.
- <u>Information Booth supplemental funding</u> was less than anticipated.
- Mental health treatment and resources support contracts were less than requested.
- <u>Summer learning program</u> needs were less than requested.
- After-school programming request wasn't needed due to other available school funds.
- <u>School Technology</u> needs were less than requested as other funding sources were available for education technology.
- <u>Rail Trail-Lead Mills/Bridge Construction</u> costs were reallocated to other portions of rail trail or other ARPA projects due to extended permitting timelines.
- Chart of Accounts Redesign and Implementation contract was less than requested.
- Hobbs House Window Replacement contract was less than requested.
- <u>Improve Universal access to Piper Field and Playground</u> could not meet the December obligation deadline and was reallocated to ADA Transition work for sidewalks.

Next, we identified projects with critical one-time needs that could be obligated by the given deadline.

Projects being allocated funds:

- Gerry School Playground and Park Improvement were allocated additional funds to cover project costs.
- Mary Alley Building HVAC Design is a critical project with many dual heating and cooling units beyond their life cycle and not working.
- Fiber Loop Switches project funding is to connect the new fiber loop to the municipal buildings.
- <u>Electrical Work</u> for the installation of two backup generators, one at the Police Station and one at the COA building.
- <u>Elevator Switch</u> is a state-required repair to the elevator at Abbot Hall which is used to access the meeting rooms, accessible restroom, and parking. Not meeting the state deadline for repairs would result in the closing of Abbot Hall for public access.
- <u>Tank Removal</u> to remove the Police Station's original tank at the end of its useful life to install a new backup generator for the station.
- <u>Munis Amendment 3</u> will provide two onsite trainers for the new system. One will be dedicated to the schools, and one will be dedicated to the Town. In addition, the town will receive additional conversion support as the Town is doing multiple system conversions simultaneously to be on one fully integrated system.
- <u>Digitization of Records</u> project will be used to digitize the planning and engineering documents, improving staff and resident access to important documents and creating more space at Mary Alley Building for staff operations.
- <u>ADA Transition work for sidewalks</u> will provide funding to bring additional sidewalks into ADA compliance.
- School Capital needs will be used by the schools for any capital shortfall and needs.

We request the Select Board vote to approve the following reallocations of ARPA funding. With this approval, we expect to have successfully allocated the entirety of the \$6,144,029.93 in ARPA funding provided to Marblehead.
