MINUTES, September 13, 2016

Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm

Pam Roberts came before the Board to give an update on the Recycling Committee. A vendor for Styrofoam collection might be brought in for the next Household Hazardous Waste Day. She also asked for a map of the layout of the new transfer station. The committee is requesting a list of items that are accepted presently at the transfer station. Also, a list of items for drop off at the health department. Pam is hoping to show the movie "Racing to Zero" at the local town theatre. A video of single stream recycling is also being established.

Andrew told the Board that the Marblehead Counseling Center recommended the funds from the teen substance abuse grant should be utilized through the state. He also explained that there is an Opioid working group in town that has put together a flyer for the public and information about administering Narcan.

- Flu clinics will be held for employees and youth. No flu mist will be available.
- Beach testing is over for the season.

- Leaf collection is fast approaching. Landscapers might be returning to drop off leaves at the transfer station. The fee would be approximately \$2500.00 per truck (\$1250.00 for leaf season only). Further discussion at the next meeting.
